## **Ponderings...**

(From Erin this time – enjoy!)

Two podcasts I listen to regularly are <u>Dare to Lead and Unlocking Us</u> from Brené Brown. She is a research professor (PhD) at the University of Houston, has written <u>several books</u> (I recommend them all), and her Ted Talk on the <u>power of vulnerability</u> has over 52 million views. While she studies topics that seem intangible to me (courage, shame, empathy), she has a line that I love, "Maybe stories are just data with a soul." Many of you know that I love data, and so I appreciate that Brené endeavors to find data in spaces that seem so tricky – like emotion.

My love of Brené is not today's topic. Rather, I want to focus on something I heard in her most recent <u>Dare to Lead podcast</u>, which was a two-parter with Dr. Susan David, who is also a researcher of emotions. All content from Brené has a wealth of practical insight and wisdom for daily life, but a lot of what she talks about is also applicable in the work environment (her book,

Dare to Lead, is based on her research and targeted to those who want to be leaders). One of the most profound moments during the podcast with Susan Davis occurred during the second part when they were talking about leadership and how one of the most important things you can do as a leader, and as a parent, is to make sure that people feel seen. To say to them, "I see you."

I believe these three words are incredibly powerful, not just for leaders and parents, but for everyone. For all of us. Particularly as we continue to move through and eventually beyond this pandemic. Covid has wreaked havoc on not just a social and economic scale; it has upended our individual and collective emotional and mental well-being. The end of this pandemic will likely unveil a new epidemic as it relates to mental health, which is a separate discussion entirely. My bigger point is whether you are a leader – a business owner, CEO, or managers – or whether you are an employee, colleague, parent or friend – you have the ability to help just by saying "I see you." This is an essential act that people need in order to begin to process emotions.

When you interact with another, regardless of whether they are upset and struggling to hold it together, are frustrated because they do not know how to solve a technical problem or do not understand how something works, or whether they're stuck trying to figure out how to word a difficult email...they don't necessarily need you to *fix it*. They just need to be **heard**. As Brené says, "I see you; I see the struggle. I get it. You're not alone." Maybe you do know the answer and can solve the problem, but before you propose the solution, acknowledge the challenge they are facing. Tell them you see them *and* their struggle. And then offer to help.
